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overview

The Master in History of Art and Museum Studies degree is awarded Sorbonne University in Paris and delivered by world-class academics in Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi. The programme offers diverse approaches to the theory and history of museums, their missions and functions.

Students will study the evolution of museums and their relevance in education. They will learn about collections management, exhibition planning and design, communication and education, acquisitions, loans and collaborations with galleries and cultural organisations. Students will study the history of museums by exploring their missions and functions on a national and global scale. They will use their analytical proficiency to objectively critique works of art and confidently discuss art movements which will improve visual and critical thinking capabilities. They will learn about the properties of various materials and techniques used by artists throughout history. This degree highlights various art movements from different cultures and encourages students to explore the role of art in relation to other disciplines as well as to examine how art connects cultures, societies and media.

The curriculum is delivered by visiting professors coming both from the Department of History of Art and Archaeology at Sorbonne University in France and from curators, conservators, document makers, registrars and other museum professionals teaching at the École du Louvre. Our faculty has achieved worldwide acclaim and imparts a thorough knowledge of Art and Museums through theoretical courses, case studies, lectures, seminars and workshops.





Programme *highlights*

→ International recognition

Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi offers the combined experience of the world-renowned Department of Art History and Archaeology at Sorbonne University along with an exclusive collaboration with the École du Louvre. Both these French institutions are internationally acclaimed as two of the best places to study Art History, Archaeology and Museum Studies. This rich heritage of joint excellence is now available in Abu Dhabi under the Ministry of Education and is recognised worldwide.

→ Networking

Each class will have a limited number of students from different countries. A strict entry selection procedure will guarantee the quality of the degree and will allow you to expand your personal network with high potential peers.

Within the next decade, the UAE will be the scene for the development of a strong artistic legacy in the region. In Abu Dhabi, Saadiyat Island aims to be a multi-faceted cultural destination and will host some of the most compelling museums in the world, including the Louvre Abu Dhabi and Guggenheim museums. Dubai has emerged as a regional art hub with its numerous galleries and Sharjah boasts a wide range of Art museums and exhibitions.

The Master in History of Art and Museum Studies at Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi was specifically designed to meet the future demand for specialists in the arts and culture sectors in the UAE.



Structure

The degree in History of Art and Museums Studies is taught in English and covers a total of four semesters across two years. At the end of this degree, you will have a total of 120 credits. The exclusively designed course schedule includes evening classes in consideration of students who intend to combine their studies with work.

Master's thesis

Students will be required to submit an extended essay based on their internship.

Internship

Sorbonne University Abu Dhabi has integrated a mandatory internship in the second year.

The internship will encourage critical thinking and improve students' reasoning abilities by blending academic theory with real life work experience. Students will benefit from a greater depth of experience working in a professional environment.

Students will spend 12 weeks at a French museum in Paris to discover French cultural heritage, meet professionals and build their network to further develop the relations between French and Emirati museums.

The internship also provides an excellent opportunity to gain crucial insights and improve access to various career opportunities in the region and beyond. Students will discover that this collaborative learning process can lead to enduring professional relationships, which will open doors and forge new career paths.

Assessment & graduation requirements

Throughout the year, there will be frequent assessment and evaluations. Students will be evaluated on individual assignments, reports and examinations. Attendance to all classes is mandatory and it is important that students are punctual and observe university regulations at all times.



Career prospects

Graduates can look forward to interesting positions such as Production Managers, Cultural Programmers, Curators, Literature Reviewers, Collection Supervisors, Registrars, Educational Managers, Editorial and Multimedia Managers, Public Policy Advisors and Communication Officers amongst others.



Admission prospects

Admission to our master's programmes is selective and competitive and each applicant will be considered on his/her own merit. Our admissions process ensures that every course has an ideal mix of people with talent, impressive interpersonal skills and a positive attitude.

General entry requirements

- Bachelor in a relevant field with a CGPA of 3 out of 4 or equivalent. Candidates with a GPA between 2.5 and 2.99 (or equivalent scores as per the equivalency table) may be conditionally admitted under probation during the first semester. The student will be authorized to continue in the program only if they secure an average of at least 12 out of 20 which is obtained by the end of the first semester. The decision is based on academic performance and will be made official after the completion of the first semester
 - or Bachelor with minimum of 2nd class honours
 - or Bachelor with an average of 12 out of 20
 - Bachelor students with a GPA below 3 may be admitted on the ground of their professional and/or personal experience, in case they are granted a VAPP by SU's or UP's VAPP commission
 - IELTS certificate with minimum overall band of 6.0 with a validity of 2 years or TOEFL certificate with minimum score of 79 (or equivalent) with a validity of 2 years, or Native English speaker who completed 3 complete years in an English-medium institution within a maximum period of 3 years or equivalent
- Shortlisted candidates will be asked to attend an interview to assess the candidate's motivation, career expectations and relevant professional experience in the degree area. Applicants who earned their undergraduate degrees from universities outside the UAE must present a Certificate of Equivalency

issued by the UAE Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research. Applicants, who are holders of undergraduate degrees issued by a licensed higher education institution in the UAE, are required to submit a copy of their degrees attested by the UAE Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research.
